1 (PHONE RINGING)  
2 S: Hello. Hello, hello.  
3 D: Hey baby.  
4 S: Hi.  
5 D: How's my baby doing?  
6 S: Doing good, what a wonderful surprise.  
7 D: Oh bab... OHHH well what are you doing, I know you're doing...  
8 S: No, no, no, no, no wonderful surprise, no, I'm okay. I'm okay, you think I'm in front of a... in  
9 a meeting or something, no I'm not.  
10 D: Okay.  
11 S: I'm not, I have been already, as you know, but I'm not now.  
12 D: How's it been going? You sound more energized.  
13 S: What do you mean more? Oh, okay, yeah I was a little down, that's because, you know why.  
14 How is everything going with you?  
15 D: It's okay baby, I've been just working and working and working and it's been good, been  
16 good. I've been staying busy and I'm still working.  
17 S: What is that, a TV in the background?  
18 D: Yeah.  
19 S: You in the room?  
20 D: Yeah.  
21 S: Well that's good.  
22 D: Oh my goodness.  
23 S: Well the meeting went okay this morning. It went... are you distracted?  
24 D: Yeah, John was sending me an email, a long email, but ah... but ah, he had someone... and his  
25 cousin's daughter... my cousin's daughter was raped and I need John Loza representative Bender  
26 that many of the girls and their boyfriends had been approached by a person that was supposed to  
27 be acting on Loza's direction seeking to have people say that my cousin's child is a sex addict  
28 and she lured probably this 25 year old and had us accusing you.  
29 S: Um-hm.  
30 D: And, you know, if its defensive, I didn't do it and the boy is lying. So far, they haven't...  
31 They're going to have a long way to go and then... they're going to have a long way to go.  
32 S: Um-hm.  
33 D: And then they just blared some news... well I'm not going to talk about this, anyway I'm  
34 just... it's just terrible to see it.  
35 S: It is terrible to see it and he is going to be in a bad way because...  
36 D: Yeah, what is he going to do...  
37 S: He'll be in a bad way if he goes to prison, they're going to wear his little booty out.

1 D: I just don't understand. I don't... I don't... I just don't understand how he got ... well but I  
2 guess I can understand how you get here, sometimes... Anyway, let's don't spend anymore time  
3 on that. Tell me about, and I don't want a blow-by-blow, but do you think your meeting overall  
4 went okay?  
5 S: It was... No, it did not, because yesterday Brian was screaming security issues, security  
6 matters and then today his little spaz, you know they both get their little job and their little titles  
7 and they start acting like they're trying to protect their own little dollars and cents.  
8 D: That's right.  
9 S: And so because they're sitting before us saying that, you know, the Dallas Police Department  
10 is doing a fine job as if they don't have any security matters and I'm looking like, well if you...  
11 why are we here?  
12 D: Heh-heh.  
13 S: My time is much too valuable to be wasting.  
14 D: Heh-heh.  
15 S: And they [UI] budgetary matters and I just... in a rut... and that Mark Jones person.  
16 D: Oh, Mark Jones.  
17 S: He gives me the impression that he's trying to make sure don't nobody come in and take over  
18 his money. Don't be touching my money, you know, don't interfere with my salary and he's,  
19 you know, talking about we gotta make budgetary decisions and I just interrupted him and I  
20 just... I know it was kind of rude, but I'm like we didn't come here to hear your budgetary issues.  
21 D: Oh Lord.  
22 S: We're here because Brian has security problems... and what it really is is... so what I'm going  
23 to have them do is just give an assessment of just one of the properties and tell him where, you  
24 know, let him come back and tell them what the... because after I said that to Brian, Brian said  
25 well why don't you just hold the guys off because we don't want to waste anybody's time and let  
26 me just talk to my people, because if you're saying that they said that they don't have security  
27 issues, then maybe I should talk to them because that's what they've been saying to me. So I...  
28 you know, I think what I'm going to do is just have him give an assessment, look at the situation  
29 and give an assessment of it and let Ms. Allen look at the situation and give... so that they can

31 D: Very good, very good.  
32 S: We don't have a security problem.  
33 D: Very good.

2 daytime with your A/C units and then you want to sit in front of somebody and say everything is  
3 just fine, then these are professionals here, you can't... don't waste... mine is different, I'm your  
4 consultant you're paying me. I don't want you wasting my time but at least don't waste anyone  
5 else's.

6 D: You will hear me shake in a certain way, so I'm leaving you alone until you interact with him,  
7 now because he's got money \_\_\_\_\_ you're going to treat him with respect and professional, and  
8 try to do...

9 S: Right, right, right. Well he's already wavered on me.

10 D: Yeah.

11 S: This is wavering in my opinion.

12 D: Yeah.

13 S: Yesterday you're crying security and you're not making any money in the southern sector  
14 because of the lack of security.

15 D: Yesterday...

16 S: And today I bring you a viable person to the table that can bring a cure to your situation and  
17 here you are, your staff is singing a different song. So that's wavering to me.

18 D: And, yesterday you were going to just fix all the problems that he had.

19 S: Mmm-hmm.

20 D: Everything, I was going to turn it all over to you, okay.

21 S: Mmm-hmm.

22 D: Just look at everything, so this is why D'Angelo, sometimes, will have a degree of frustration  
23 with him because D'Angelo talks to him a lot and he's had an opportunity to be able to see him  
24 in the various faces that he puts on.

25 S: Mmm-hmm

26 D: He's a complicated guy. And see what keeps it real simple for me is that I don't deal with  
27 him a lot, I deal with him when he's got a problem and I deal with him when he's trying to  
28 basically give some directional guidance and I give it to him, but I don't interact with him a lot,  
29 and what I'm seeing is based on everybody that I've talked to, that talks about him. And this  
30 goes all the way back, all the way back to Rosemont over at Kimberly Hills when him and H.J.  
31 Johnson were buds, close, tight, you know, and now they can't talk to one another, you know.

32 S: Mmm-hmm.

33 D: I mean I've got three years of hearing all kinds of people talk about him so it's never exactly  
34 as it appears to be with him.

35 S: Mmm-hmm.

36 D: And D'Angelo understands that as well. In the short time he's worked with him, he sees that.

37 S: Mmm-hmm.

38 D: He's a good guy though, Brian's a good guy, got a good heart, he's a good guy.

39 S: Anyway so that's how that went. The folks was out there cutting the grass this morning.

40 D: I told you, I told you.

41 S: Mmm-hmm.

42 D: So why was that white man make you have to kind of go in there and fuck with him before he  
43 does something?

44 S: I don't know. Maybe because he's not white he's Pakistan or something, with a name like  
45 Salih S-A-L-I-H, he's Arab or something. One of them third world folks [laughs]. Man, I'm  
46 ready to come to Washington now.

1 D: Huh?  
2 S: I'm ready to come to Washington now.  
3 D: Well, baby.  
4 S: You're not ready for me to come.  
5 D: Now, now is not the time.  
6 S: What you doing, pulling a Brian on me? I'm warning you dog.  
7 D: [inaudible]  
8 S: Huh?  
9 D: [inaudible]  
10 S: What?  
11 D: You have the time.  
12 S: No, I said what are you doing, pulling a Brian on me? This morning you were all sweet and  
13 lovey and now you're like, it's not the time.  
14 D: No, baby, I'm with you baby, I'm for you. I'm for you baby, I'm for you. I'm for you baby,  
15 I'm for you, I'm for you. (singing). Man I've been working, Brenda and I've been... we've been  
16 going today man.  
17 S: Hmm. Babe.  
18 D: [inaudible] I just wanted to call you and tell you I love you baby.  
19 S: Aww. Are you going to do it some more today.  
20 D: Huh?  
21 S: Are you going to do that some more today?  
22 D: Do what some more?  
23 S: Call me and tell me that some more today?  
24 D: Oh yeah, baby I will, I will, I will, tell you some more.  
25 S: You promise?  
26 D: Promise I'm going to tell you some more. Oh man, I tell you the truth, I'm just really so  
27 happy that God has blessed my secretary and I to be getting along better. I'm just really happy  
28 about that. Just really happy about that. And then baby, you're mine, you're mine and I had a  
29 good discussion this morning with some of my colleagues on the.... on my... on the, you know,
