That is when I noticed it was D'Angelo Lee hanging out the passenger window waving at me trying to get my attention. He yelled "Hey how you doing", "how have you been", "I know you were the one not dismissed" and other things I couldn't really understand, but I just smiled and tried to ignore him. He was very loud, yelling over the black suburban he was the passenger in. He was making motions as if he wanted me to call him. My husband was in the theater still when all of this was going on. When he made it back to the car, I told him what just happened. As we drove out of the parking lot, we had to drive past the black suburban, and Lee continued to wave, and signal for me to call him. He did this until we could no longer see him.

We then drove to Sonic on I-20 & Polk Road, when my husband (driving) told me that they were behind us, and it appeared they were following us. We pulled into the Sonic drive up window at 3:55pm. The black suburban pulled up along the side of us and the driver signaled for me to roll down my window. The driver (an African American male) asked my husband if Lee could ask me a few questions about a "court case". I then said "I have no comment". Lee then said "well I understand if you don't want to talk to me". I then repeated "I have no comment".

They politely said thank you and have a nice day. You can tell Lee was a bit agitated, by me not wanting to talk. They then drove next door to the gasoline station. They had two small children w/them, from what I could tell.

I would of not made this a big deal if he had only waved and commented at the movies, but the fact that he made the effort to follow us to the Sonic was unnecessary. That is where I feel he crossed the line. If I had not had my husband with me, I probably wouldn't had the courage to tell them "No", that I did not want to talk to them considering it was two men.
